10 Things We Learned in Disciple-Making During the COVID-19 Crisis

- 1. Disciple-making and evangelism are not at odds.
- 2. Everything in your church is a component of disciple-making to differing degrees; everything communicates.
- 3. Disciple-making is about your people <u>living</u> and <u>multiplying</u> the gospel in their spheres of influence and beyond.
- 4. Disciple-making requires core attributes that you want to see in the lives of your people (email Lance Crowell for some sample lists of these lcrowell@sbtexas.com).
- 5. Disciple-making affects all of the programming of your church.
- 6. Create natural on-ramps and off-amps for disciple-making once you get started.
- 7. COVID-19 has created some difficulties for meetings but it has not stopped the ability for groups to grow or develop.
- 8. The combining of some of the spiritual attributes of your system with an event or difficulty deepens the depths of the value for your people.
- 9. How would I start making disciples?
 - o On your knees prayer
 - Core group staff, converts, new people to church, your local community
 - o Clear understanding of what you want to see accomplished what is effective
 - What is the curriculum that you will use? It may change but just start I can help with that!
 - When they are ready to do the same in someone else's life
 - Launch them out to go and do the same

10. Notice: How not to start making disciples

- Preach about it
- o Initiate a program let people sign up
- Change all the things you do create a system
- Call yourself a disciple-making church change in language
- Make it a very extensive process
